



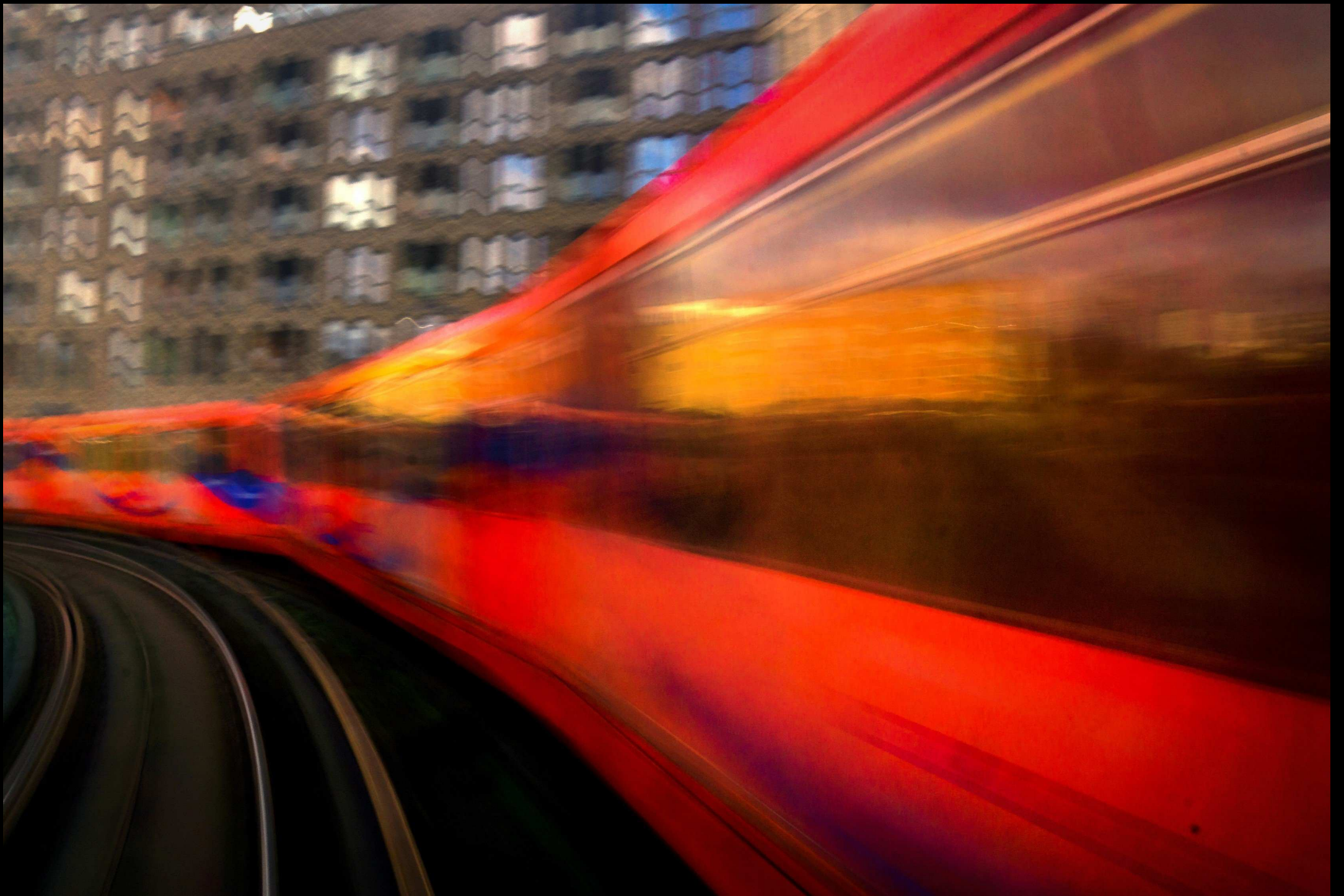

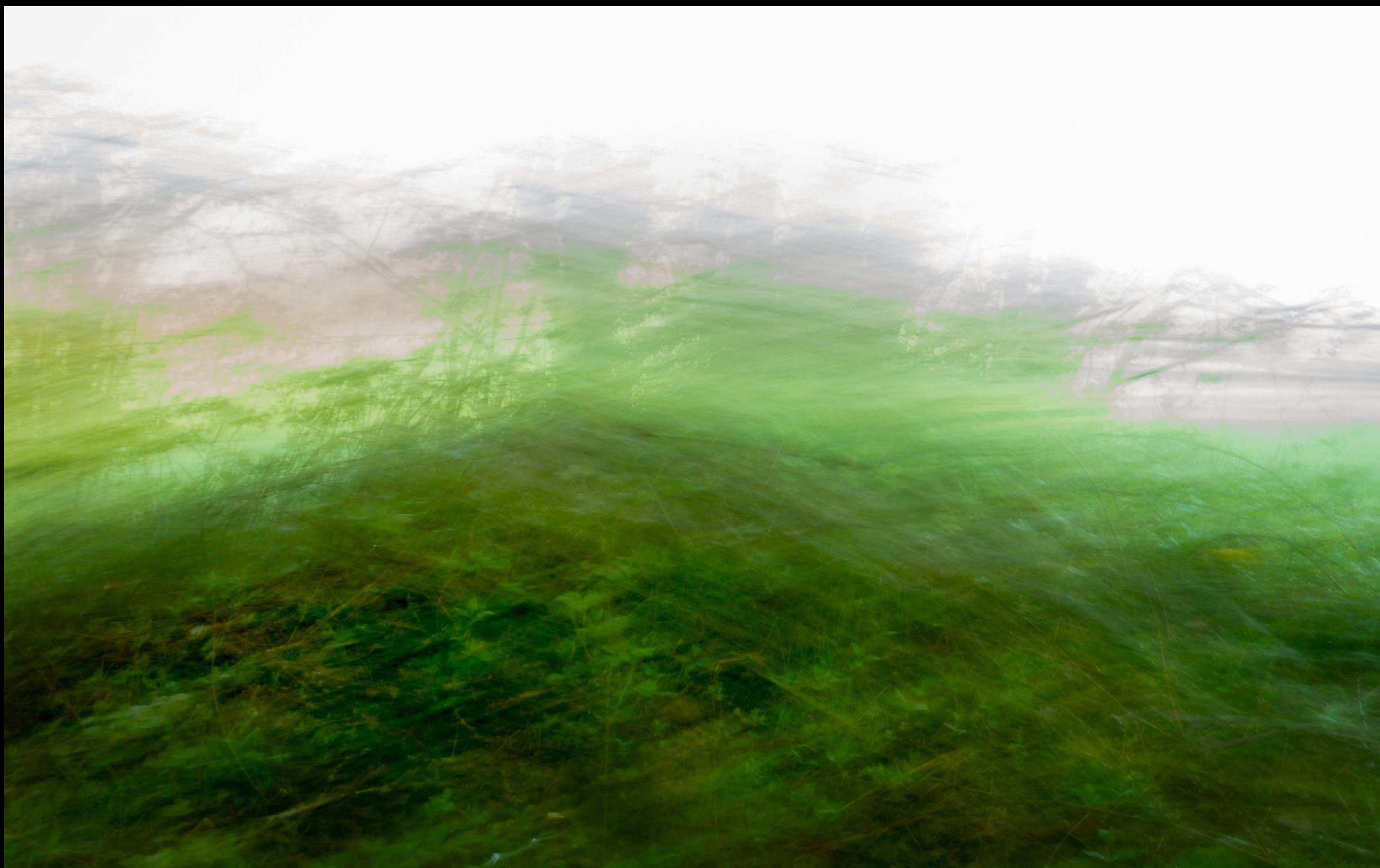
Demonstrating movement is more complex than it first appears, but my taste tends towards the abstract. So here is my look at the world of movement taken over a number of years up to the middle of 2022.



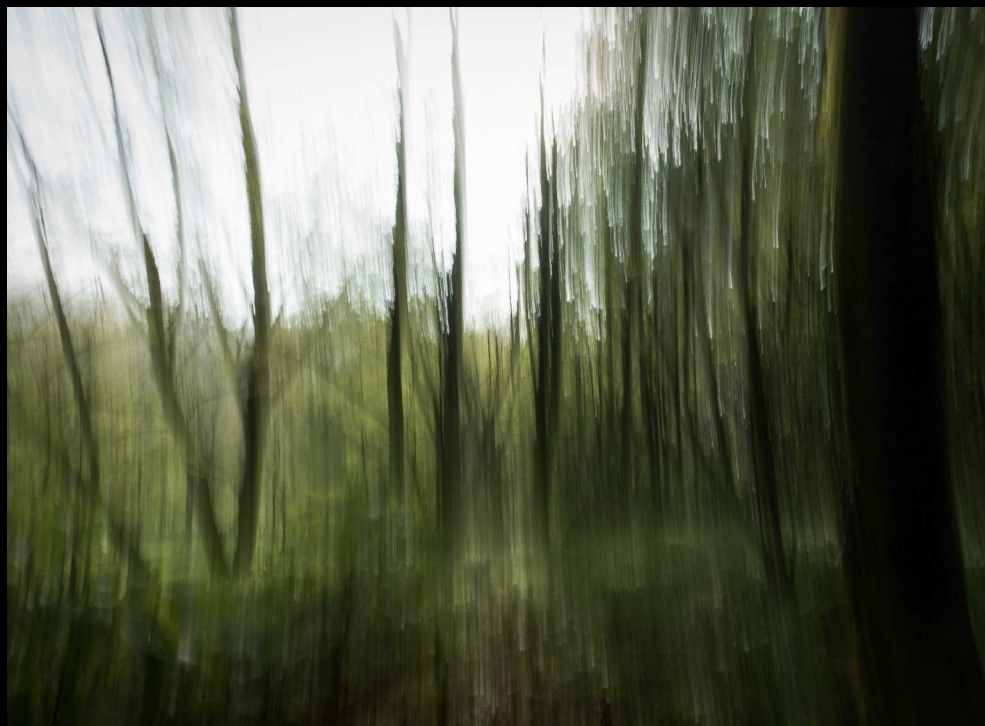
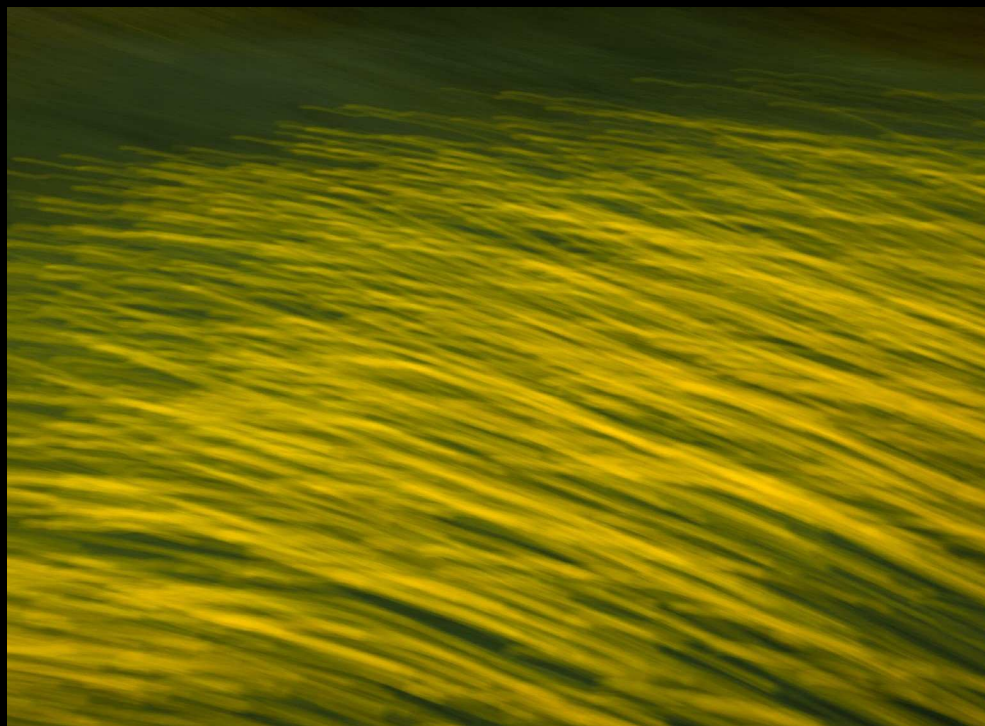

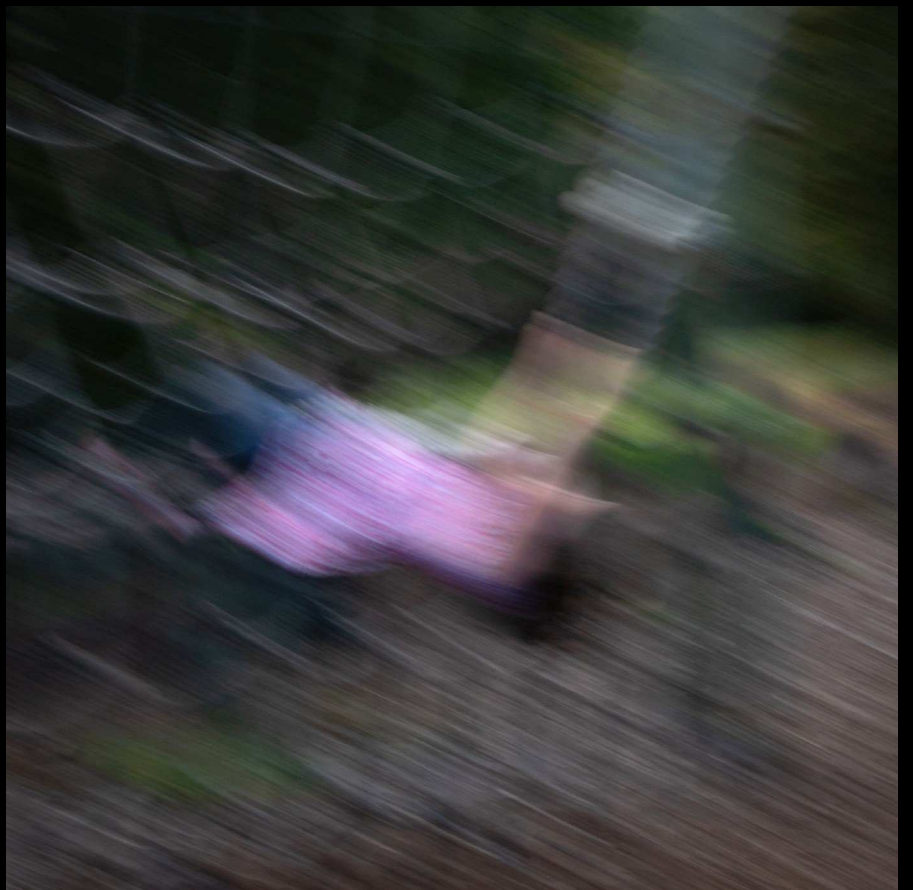

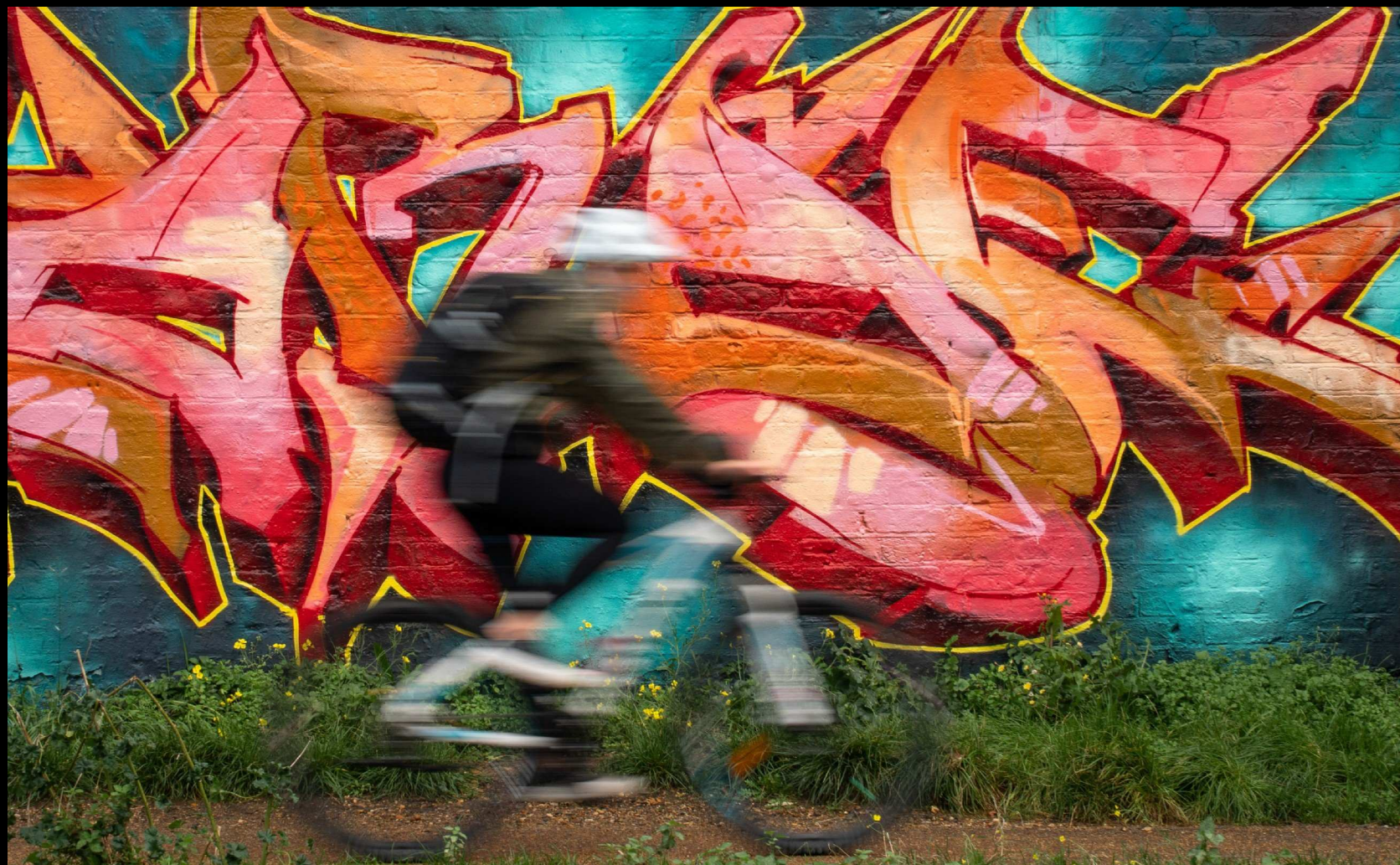
